



# International Application for Fall 2010 Admission

## Four Steps to an Easier Application

### 1 Apply online

We encourage you to use our online application, which is secure, allows you to pay by credit card, and provides immediate confirmation that your application has been received. Last year, over 95 percent of our applicants used our online application. To apply online, go to [www.admissions.unc.edu](http://www.admissions.unc.edu).

### 2 Beat the deadline

Submit your application well before the deadline. This gives your recommenders more time to prepare

their parts of your application. It also gives us more time to notify you of missing items and ensure your application is complete.

### 3 Make sure your application is complete

No later than four weeks after you submit your application, we will begin notifying you regularly, by e-mail and through your MyUNC Account, of any required credentials that are missing from your file.

### 4 Check your e-mail and your MyUNC Account often

Because we use e-mail and your MyUNC Account to advise you of missing items, please check them frequently. We will post your admissions decision on your MyUNC Account. Please make sure we have an accurate e-mail address where we can reach you throughout the year. If your address changes, notify us immediately either by updating your profile on your MyUNC Account or by writing to us.

## International Applicants

We welcome the applications of students world-wide. International applicants are encouraged to apply online or submit their applications as early as possible to avoid any international postal delays. The University seeks to admit those students who have excelled inside and outside the classroom in a variety of ways. Those students who have compiled exceptional educational records while meeting the academic challenge of unusually rigorous course work are most readily admitted here. (Please provide English translations for any documents not already printed in English. Your application will be withdrawn from consideration if we do not receive all required information.)

The University receives applications from many highly qualified students from educational systems worldwide; therefore, to be competitive for admission requires that applicants be enrolled in a curriculum that normally leads to a university education. For instance, students applying from British systems could be preparing for A-Levels and those applying from a French system might be completing their final year of study or perhaps have already completed the baccalaureate. Personal interviews are not a factor in our decision.

The admission of an international student is based on: a) scholastic performance demonstrating high probability of success, b) English proficiency (TOEFL or IELTS and SAT or ACT), c) evidence indicating a student's ability to adjust well to the university, d) proper visa status, and e) verification of financial support.

## Application Checklist

We encourage students to use our online application (available at [www.admissions.unc.edu](http://www.admissions.unc.edu)), but will gladly accept a paper copy. Copies of all forms in this application may be downloaded from [www.admissions.unc.edu](http://www.admissions.unc.edu). If you submit a paper application, please complete the following steps.

- Application** (Section A)—Complete the application carefully. Be sure to print your complete name on each page, including essays.
- Statement from School Official and Transcript** (section B)—Fill out the applicant section of the Statement from School Official and submit it to your guidance counselor or college advisor. If your school permits, return the completed statement and transcript in a sealed envelope with your application. Otherwise, they can be mailed separately to UNC-Chapel Hill.
- Teacher Recommendation** (Section C)—Complete the applicant section of the Teacher Recommendation form and give it to your teacher. Request that the letter be returned to you in a sealed envelope, and enclose it with your application.
- Financial Certificate and Sources of Support** (Section D)—Applicants who are not United States citizens are required by law to certify sufficient financial resources to pay for their education and related expenses. Visa documents are issued only when all admission procedures have been satisfied.
- Test Scores**—Have your SAT Reasoning Test and/or ACT (with writing) scores sent directly to UNC-Chapel Hill. If SAT Subject Test scores are available, we recommend that you have them sent to us as well. Submit official TOEFL or IELTS results if English is not your native language.
- Translate non-English documents**—Provide English translations for any documents not already printed in English.
- Make Copies**—For your records, make a duplicate copy of all materials you are submitting to UNC-Chapel Hill. You will also need to bring these photocopies to your visa interview. We regret that we cannot return your original application materials to you.
- Submission**—Mail the signed application (including the financial certificate, essays, nonrefundable \$70 fee, and teacher recommendation) to UNC-Chapel Hill. If permitted by your school, also enclose the School Official Statement and transcript.

### Check Your MyUNC Account Often for Updates on Your Application Status

No later than four weeks after we receive your application, we will regularly update your MyUNC account with the status of your application, including any missing items.

## Detailed Directions

### Create Your MyUNC Account

To create your MyUNC account, go to our Web site at [www.admissions.unc.edu](http://www.admissions.unc.edu) and select "MyUNC" from the drop-down menu for prospective students. Once you complete your profile, you'll receive a confidential username and password. To apply online, log into your MyUNC account and follow the simple online directions. Whether you apply online or on paper, be sure to check your MyUNC account often for important messages about your application.

### \$70 Application Fee

We require a nonrefundable application fee of US\$70. If you apply online, you may pay the fee by credit card or money order. If you apply on paper, you must pay by cashier's check or money order drawn on a US bank in US dollars. Your check or money order should be payable to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; it must clearly indicate your full legal name and your date of birth. Please do not send cash; we regret we cannot accept it.

### Official SAT or ACT Scores

We require that you take either the SAT Reasoning Test or the ACT (with writing) and have an official score report sent directly to us by the testing service. You should take the exam by November to meet the First Deadline and by December to meet the Second Deadline. If you've taken any SAT Subject Tests, we recommend that you provide these scores as well. When you register for a test, request that your scores be sent to UNC-Chapel Hill (SAT code 5816 and ACT code 3162).

If you've already taken a test and didn't list UNC-Chapel Hill, call the appropriate testing service and ask that your scores be sent to us. For SAT Reasoning Test scores, call (866) 756-7346; for ACT scores, call (319) 337-1313. Because the testing service sends us the scores electronically, you do not need to pay for expedited mail delivery.

### English Proficiency

Students currently attending a school where English is not the language of instruction or students for whom English is not their first language are required to submit scores from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS). A score of 100+ on the internet-based TOEFL (or 250+ on the computer version) or a band score of 7.0 or higher on the IELTS is considered competitive. These examinations are administered at many testing centers throughout the world several times each year. Please take the test before January to ensure that your test scores reach us in time. Test scores should be sent directly from the Educational Testing Service or IELTS Worldwide to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, using the University's score reporting code of 5816. ### Essays

We require one long and one short essay. If applying on paper, complete your essays on separate sheets and enclose them with the rest of your application. Please include your complete name and your date of birth at the top of each sheet. Your essays are very important and will be evaluated not only for admission, but also for possible selection for the Honors Program and merit-based scholarships.

### Statement from School Official

Whether you apply online or on paper, complete the applicant portion of the Statement from School Official and give the form to your guidance or college counselor to complete. If your school permits, please return the completed statement and transcript in a sealed envelope with your application. Your counselor may submit these materials in a separate envelope if you are applying online or if that is the policy of your school.

### Teacher Recommendation

If you apply online, you will be asked to provide the e-mail address of the teacher who will write a letter of recommendation on your behalf. We will then e-mail your teacher with easy-to-follow instructions. If your teacher would rather submit a paper recommendation or if you submit a paper application, please complete the applicant portion of the Teacher Recommendation form and give it, along with an envelope, to the teacher of your choice. Please include the form and recommendation with the rest of your paper application. The teacher may submit your recommendation in a separate envelope if you are applying online or if that is the policy of your school.

We require only one teacher recommendation and find one letter to be sufficient. If you have extenuating circumstances and plan to provide more than one letter of recommendation, we urge you to include all letters with your application. While we can confirm that we have received a letter of recommendation on your behalf, we cannot confirm the name of the teacher who submitted a paper recommendation.

### Financial Certificate and Sources of Support

A student must be a citizen of the United States to qualify for our financial aid. We apologize, but the University does not provide financial aid to citizens of other countries who are studying or planning to study in the United States. For this reason, applicants who are not United States citizens are required by law to certify sufficient financial resources to pay for their education and related expenses. The enclosed financial certificate must be completed and submitted with your application or your application will be considered incomplete and cannot go to the Admissions Committee.

### Honor Code / Community Standards

Please answer carefully all of the questions in the Honor Code part of the application. If you overlook one or more of these questions, your application will be considered incomplete and we will return the form to you for completion. If you answer "yes" to any Community Standards question, an explanation is required and must be included with your application. Your failure to provide complete, accurate, and truthful information on this application will be grounds to deny or withdraw your admission, or to dismiss you after enrollment.

## Honors

When you apply for admission, we will automatically consider you for the Honors Program. We will consider all of the information you include with your application and will pay special attention to your essays, which are a critical part of the selection for the Honors Program.

## Scholarships

We are able to consider international students for a very limited number of merit scholarships. There is no separate application for these scholarships; we will consider your admissions application for any available merit scholarships.

Students attending one of the 12 United World Colleges are eligible for the Davis Scholars Program. The Davis Scholars program will award up to \$10,000 to matriculating United World College graduates who are able to demonstrate financial need. UNC-Chapel Hill will provide the remaining costs of attendance to include full tuition, fees, room/board and some travel costs. ## Midyear Grades

We may require that you submit your midyear grades online through your MyUNC account. If we require them, we will notify you by e-mail and on your MyUNC account. Please do not ask your guidance counselor to submit your midyears on your behalf.

## Interviews

While all applicants are welcome to visit campus, we do not use interviews evaluatively. We rely on the materials you provide with your application to make admissions decisions.

## About Admission for Students with Disabilities

Each application for admission is considered in competition with all other applications. However, if you believe that your academic progress has been affected by disability-related issues, you may voluntarily submit documentation about the disability and its specific impact on your educational experiences. If you supply such documentation, we will keep it confidential and use it only as part of our voluntary efforts to comply with federal regulation 34 CFR 104.42. Your choosing to supply this information will not subject you to any discriminatory treatment.

## International Transfers

We welcome students who would like to transfer to Carolina from other post-secondary institutions around the world. Students who have completed college-level work and wish to transfer to Carolina should complete the regular transfer application. ## Admissions Appeal

According to University policy, appeals concerning individual admission, or admission rescission, decisions may be had only if it is contended that: (a) a provision set forth in The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill Admissions Policy has been violated, or (b) the decision not to admit the individual or to rescind admission resulted from a material procedural error in the admissions process. If you wish to appeal your decision, you must do so in writing to the Director of Undergraduate Admissions within 30 days after receipt of your decision letter. The complete appeals policy is available in the Undergraduate Bulletin and can be viewed at [www.unc.edu/ugradbulletin/admissions.html](http://www.unc.edu/ugradbulletin/admissions.html).

## Schedule Changes

The strength of your curriculum will be an important factor in our decision about your candidacy. If your schedule changes for any reason between the time you file your application and the time you receive your decision, you must notify us in writing immediately; if you don't, we reserve the right to reevaluate your application at a later date and to change any decision we might have made. Moreover, if your schedule changes after you have been offered admission to Carolina, we reserve the right to reevaluate your application and, if necessary, to revoke your admission. Admitted students who are contemplating a change in their schedule must notify us before the change, indicating their proposed new schedule and their reasons for the change. Requests may be emailed to [schedule@admissions.unc.edu](mailto:schedule@admissions.unc.edu) or mailed to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. We will review and respond to all requests as promptly as possible.

## Financial Information

Students must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States to qualify for federal financial aid. Applicants who are not United States citizens or permanent residents who intend to request a visa certificate from UNC are required by law to certify that they have sufficient financial resources to pay for their education and related expenses. The financial certificate must be completed and submitted with your application or your application will be considered incomplete and cannot go to the Admissions Committee. **All international students should complete the Financial Certificate: Personal Information (section D-1). However, Sources of Support (section D-2) is not required for those students who will not request a UNC visa document.**

The University's Student Aid program can provide funds for applicants who are United States citizens, nationals, permanent residents with I-151 or I-551 Alien Registration Receipt Cards ("green cards"), permanent residents of the Northern Mariana Islands and Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, and other non-citizens who have Arrival-Departure Records (I-94) showing "refugee" or "adjustment applicant" or official grant of asylum in the United States. Some international students receive financial assistance from sources outside the University. Consult publications available through your school, the United States Information Service Library, or the United States Consulate in your country. You may also wish to investigate possible sources of financial assistance from your government or organizations in your country. You should begin these inquiries as early as possible. Due to federal regulations restricting work authorization, most international students should not expect employment to be a significant means of financial support while studying at UNC-Chapel Hill.

### Estimated Costs

Estimated costs are listed below and on the enclosed *Financial Certificate*. Costs are "estimated" because there is always the possibility of increases in tuition and fees over the course of your education, and increases in the cost of living should be anticipated. Expenses are estimated for one academic year (August through May) for a single student and do not include transportation between the University and your country:

The *Financial Certificate* and *Sources of Support* need to indicate your personal information, including your country of citizenship, and evidence that you and/or whoever is sponsoring your education has resources set aside to take care of your expenses for at least one year. An accompanying, original current (within six months) bank certification, signed and dated by a bank official, must show funds for one year's expenses. The amount should at least equal the "Estimate for academic year" shown above. However, sponsors should certify that funds will be available for each year of your undergraduate program at UNC. The *Financial Certificate*, *Sources of Support*, sponsor's letter, bank statements, and signatures must be originals. The visa certificate cannot be issued until the University receives original documentation.
